Intro:

1. What are the bases of fellowship in Christ?

Body:

- I. Christ is the foundation of fellowship in Jesus 1 Jn. 1:3.
 - A. Jesus is the very foundation—1 Cor. 3:11.
 - 1. Without Jesus, there is no fellowship.
 - a. Our tolerant society sees it differently.
 - b. Such a view is inconsistent with Biblical teaching.(1) Our fellowship is "in Christ."
 - B. Fellowship with the Father & the Son is necessary 1 Jn. 1:3.
 - 1. One is called into fellowship by the Father 1 Cor. 1:9; Rom. 8:29-30; 2 Th. 2:13-14.
 - 2. Fellowship is consummated through baptism 1 Pet 3:21; Acts 2:38; Acts 22:16.
- II. Truth is the guiding principle of fellowship in Jesus 1 Jn. 1:6-7.
 - A. To walk in the light is to walk in the truth 2 Jn. 4; 3 Jn. 4.
 - 1. We can know truth Ps. 119:151 & 160; Jn. 8:31-32.
 - 2. Truth sets us free from the bondage of sin Jn. 8:34.
 - B. To walk in the light is to be saved according to truth—
 1 Tim. 2:3-4; Jas. 1:18; 1 Pet. 2:22.
 - C. To walk in the light is to worship in truth Jn. 4:23.
 - D. To walk in the light is to continue steadfastly in truth Acts 2:42; Jn. 16:13.
 - 1. See 1 Cor. 4:17.
 - 2. Agreement in doctrine Amos 3:3; 1 Cor. 1:10.
 - E. To walk in the light is to live according to truth Ps. 119:160; 2 Jn. 4 & 6.
 - F. What about those outside of Christ 1 Cor. 5:9-10.
 - 1. There can be no partnership with them 2 Jn. 9-11.

Conc:

- 1. Christ is the foundation of our fellowship. Truth is the guiding principle.
- 2. You, too, can have fellowship in Jesus.
 - a. God calls you into that fellowhsip through the gospel.
