Body:

- I. Without leaders, we become as sheep without a shepherd.
 - A. The consequences of a leaderless Israel is depicted Ezek. 34:1-5; Zech. 10:2; Matt. 9:36.
 - B. Consider the home and the church without leaders.
- II. The well being of family and of church cannot be left to chance.
 - A. When there is no leadership, another may fill the void Ex. 32:1-2; Matt. 12:43-45.
 - B. Consider the home and the church.

III. God expects you to lead.

- A. God expects you to lead in the home Eph. 5:23, Eph. 6:4.
 - 1. It is your responsibility to know 1 Pet. 3:7.
 - 2. It is your responsibility to provide 1 Tim. 5:8.
 - 3. It is your responsibility to nourish and cherish Eph. 5:28-29.
 - 4. In the case of children Eph. 6:4.
- B. God expects you to lead in the church.
 - 1. Consider the elder and the deacon 1 Tim. 3:2-4, 7-9.

IV. The results of leadership.

- A. Accomplishment is satisfying Eccl. 7:8.
- B. There is great joy in seeing your family grow Ps. 127:3-5.
- C. There is joy and satisfaction gained from seeing other Christians succeed and grow e.g., 1 Th. 2:19; 2 Tim. 1:3-5.
 - 1. There is eternal benefit 1 Cor. 3:14; Matt. 25:21.
- D. On the other hand, lack of leadership will bring heartbreak.
