


Many times churches can lose their focus as to what is important. Instead of keeping the main thing the main thing, the main thing falls into the background and other things seem to take priority.

How can we keep evangelism before the local church so it can have the priority it deserves? First, we must be sure to keep evangelism in the minds of the members by praying publically for our evangelistic efforts. As men pray publically, it would be wise to mention those who are working in the area of evangelism.
