1. Jesus came to save the lost — Matt. 1:21; Heb. 2:9; Jn. 1:29.

## Body:

- I. Jesus focused on the present.
  - A. He did not allow the past to deter Him.
    - 1. He was not discouraged by His failures Jn. 6:66.
  - B. Do we focus too much on what we have accomplished?
    - 1. Past accomplishments cannot deter us Phil. 3:13-14.
  - C. Do we lay plans and waste the present? Prov. 27:1.
  - D. We must focus on the present 2 Cor. 6:2.
- II. Jesus did not allow the desires of the flesh to prevent Him.
  - A. He was tired, thirsty, and hungry 4:6-8.
    - 1. The work of the Father Jn. 4:30-34.
    - 2. Was not weary in well doing Gal. 6:9; 1 Cor. 15:58.
  - B. Jesus' focus was upon the work He was here to do.
    - 1. Our focus should be likewise Col. 3:1-3.
- III. Jesus did not allow prejudice to restrict Him.
  - A. Jesus practiced Mk. 16:15.
  - B. The Gospel is for all Gal. 3:28.
  - C. We must not allow prejudice to restrict us Acts 10:35.
- IV. Jesus did not allow the woman's character to deter Him.
  - A. She was a sinner 4:18.
    - 1. Jesus associated with sinners Matt. 9:10-12.
      - a. Not as companions 1 Cor. 15:33.
  - B. The power to change men is found in the gospel, not in men.
- V. Jesus did not allow her lack of interest to deter him Jn. 4:9-29.
  - A. We must not become discouraged Isa. 55:10-11.

- 1. Jesus came that we might live.
  - He accomplished the task.
- 2. He has given us a task Matt. 28:19-20.
  - a. We must be diligent in the task.
